Ray, a retired attorney from Kirksville, Missouri serves as general counsel and professor of business administration for Truman State University (formerly Northeast Missouri State University) for more than 20 years. From 2001 to 2004, he served as a County Commissioner for Adair County.

A member of the Rotary Club of Kirksville and a Rotarian since 1961, he has served Rotary as district governor, chair of the 1998 Council on Legislation in New Delhi, and chair of the 2008 Los Angeles Convention Committee. He was a member of the RI Board of Directors from 1985-87 and chaired its executive committee in 1986-87. Ray joined the Rotary Foundation Trustees in 2002, serving as vice chair in 2005-06 and was a member of the Future Vision Committee. He is a Major Donor and a recipient of the Foundation's Citation for Meritorious Service and Distinguished Service Award.

Ray's wife, Judie, is a former elementary school teacher in Macon and Kirksville and a former consultant for the Child Development Assistant program at the Kirksville Area Vocational Center. They have two children, Leigh and Kurt, and three grandchildren, Morgan, Grant and Sydney Perkins.
